Both scoreboards keep score for 8 sports (basketball, handball, volleyball, tennis, table tennis, badminton, five a side and hockey) and provide a timer function. The "brains" keeping the score information is in the control panel and the panels for both scoreboards maintain the same information. The key difference is the additional information that the standard scoreboard is able to display as compared to the limited information the budget model can display.
